

EPA LEAD RENOVATION, REPAIR & PAINTING



EPA Lead Renovation, Repair & Painting (RRP) Course 8-hr



This 8-hours course trains renovation, repair and painting contractors how to work safely in housing with lead-based paint and comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule. Includes health effects, regulations, lead-safe work practices, interior and exterior containment, cleaning and water removal, record-keeping, training non-certified renovation workers, hands-on training, review and examination.

The RRP rule applies to anyone who is paid to perform work that disturbs more than six square feet of lead-based paint in housing and child-occupied facilities built before 1978. Including contractors, handymen, maintenance companies, rental property owners, schools, day care providers as well as non-profit and government agencies

Who Should Attend: Contractors who might disturb painted surfaces while doing plumbing, electrical, drywall, painting, tile, window replacement, landscaping, repairs, construction, demolition, renovation, repair and maintenance, HVAC, carpentry plus many other jobs.

OSHA Lead Awareness and Procedures Course

Building maintenance personnel and construction workers will learn proper work practices to prevent lead-based paint exposure to themselves and building occupants. Per OSHA requirements, the course covers health effects of lead exposure and various paint related activities required be followed to comply with the OSHA Lead in Construction Standard.

The OSHA Lead in Construction Standard requires training of workers who disturb lead containing painted surfaces. These activities include, but are not limited to: removing paint by sanding, scraping, abrasive blasting and performing manual demolition activities. This course includes the lead awareness class information, as well as safe work practices, site preparation, engineering controls, work area cleanup, exposure monitoring requirements and the proper use of respirators and protective clothing.

Who Should Attend: Maintenance personnel and construction workers who work in schools, residential housing and commercial buildings and perform activities that may disturb lead-containing paint where the anticipated lead exposures will be below the OSHA Action Level.

Course Dates: February 15, April 11, June 13

Asbestos Class IV OSHA & AHERA Awareness Course 4-hr

Attendees will learn how to identify suspect asbestos-containing materials, respond to asbestos emergencies, recognize asbestos hazards and prevent exposure to themselves and building occupants. The class satisfies the AHERA and OSHA Class IV requirements for training employees who are likely to come into contact with, but do not disturb asbestos containing materials.

Who Should Attend: Construction, building maintenance and janitorial personnel who work in commercial buildings and schools and who may come into contact with asbestos-containing materials.

Course Dates: January 25, February 22, March 21, April 18, May 23, June 20

Asbestos Class III OSHA O&M Course 8-hr

This class is for maintenance and contractor personnel who under the supervision of a Class III Supervisor may disturb small amounts of asbestos-containing materials as part of performing routine maintenance activities. Class IV course information as outlined above is covered, as well as how to clean up asbestos spills, repair damaged asbestos-containing materials and perform construction work in areas with friable asbestos-containing materials. Attendees are also trained in the proper use of respirators, protective clothing, HEPA vacuums and repair procedures.

Who Should Attend: Construction and building maintenance personnel who clean up small asbestos spills and repair damaged asbestos-containing materials under the supervision of a Class III Supervisor.

Course Dates: January 25, February 22, March 21, April 18, May 23, June 20

Asbestos Class III O&M Supervisor Course 16-hr

This course adds a second day of training to the Class III O&M course described above. OSHA requires individuals who supervise asbestos cleanup and repair procedures to receive additional training. The second day of training covers personnel air monitoring procedures, respirator fit-testing protocols, personal decontamination procedures, and setting up mini-enclosures and regulated areas. Attendees also receive hands-on training in spot removal of fireproofing and acoustic ceiling materials, as well as glove-bag removal of pipe insulation.

Who Should Attend: Asbestos program and health and safety managers who are responsible for the asbestos management program and who supervise Class III Asbestos Activities. Required for school district contractors.

Course Dates: January 25 & 26, February 22 & 23, March 21 & 22, April 18 & 19, May 23 & 24, June 20 & 21

Mold Prevention and Abatement Course 3-hr

As the EPA and health experts have become aware of the health effects of exposure to certain types of mold, and as indicated by the thousands of lawsuits filed in California against building owners, mold presents a health concern and significant financial liability for building owners, property managers and contractors. This class is designed to help building owners and contractors reduce the potential for mold exposures by training facility management, maintenance personnel and construction workers on identifying mold, how to prevent mold growth and abate mold hazards. The class also covers how to prevent mold problems in buildings and on construction projects.

Who Should Attend: Building maintenance personnel, construction workers, janitorial personnel and property managers.
